



2020 ANNUAL REPORT

2020 was a year like no other for every person, household, organization, and community throughout the nation.

At times I wondered how well Homeward Pikes Peak would fare with the changes in service delivery and the economic impact of the pandemic. However, HPP ended the year quite well largely due to the support from you, our community. We received nearly \$70,000 in direct contributions from individuals, acquired \$996,000 from private foundations for current programs and our two expansion projects, and secured \$1,721,633 in government support for current and future projects. HPP is humbled by the gracious donations of time, energy, and financial support. Together we achieve Recovery, Dignity, and Housing Stability for our clients, neighbors, and families!

2021 also has some big goals as well. We anticipate breaking ground on The Commons Apartment building late summer 2021, and we are planning the creation of the Bloom Residential Treatment Home that will provide housing and clinical services for pregnant and parenting women. PROGRAM MANAGERS REPORT

2020 HARBOR HOUSE RECOVERY HOME

A sober living and supportive housing program for men that addresses homelessness and addiction with onsite staff and wrap around services. We also work with individuals returning to the community for jail or prison. (Maximum 20 individuals) Serving men 21 years +

- During 2020 total of 54 men in residence over 12 months
- 72% of clients stayed in program 5 months
- 67% of residents were justice involved
- 48% secured and maintained employment during the length of their stay
- 22% of clients purchased vehicles
- 50% of clients enrolled in benefits such as Medicaid, food stamps, SSI/SSDI
- Approximately 90% regained or improved contact with family members
- 19% of clients sought medical assistance for pre-existing health conditions

2020 PROJECT DETOUR

A re-entry supportive housing program for women struggling with opioid and/or alcohol addictions with onsite staff and wrap around services. (Maximum of 9 women) Serving women 21 years +

- During 2020 total of 16 women in residence over 12 months
- Average length of stay in the Project Detour program is 8 months
- 56% of residents were compliant with parole/probation/drug court
- 50% secured and maintained employment
- 44% of clients purchased vehicles
- 100% of clients enrolled in benefits such as Medicaid, food stamps, SSI/SSDI
- Approximately 70% of the women are in contact with family members



2020 BLOOM RECOVERY HOME

A sober living supportive housing program for pregnant women or mothers of infants less than twelve months old with onsite staff and

- During 2020 total of 12 women and their child(ren) in residence over 12 months
- Average length of stay in the Bloom House program is 9 months
- 50% secured and maintained employment (child care remains a barrier)

wrap around services. Serving women 21 years + (Maximum 4 women and babies).

- 42% of clients purchased vehicles
- 75% of clients enrolled in benefits such as Medicaid, food stamps, SSI/SSDI
- Approximately 70% of the women are in contact with family members

2020 STREET OUTREACH

Working with the Colorado Springs Police Department to engage with individuals outside using parks and trails and emergency shelters experiencing long term homelessness. Our goal is to build trust and assist each person to enter shelter, housing and health care services to become self-sufficient once again. Serving all ages.

- 471 clients
- 742 encounters
- 1,228 referrals to partner agencies
- 242 clients completed a VISPDAT
- 34, including family members have stayed with HOH client
- 12, including family members staying with HOH client
- 241 housing clients
- 165 SUD or SMI clients
- 55 clients maintained sobriety in housing

2020 HOUSING FIRST

The program includes three separate permanent supportive housing programs: Housing for those with a Dual Diagnosis, Veterans Specific Housing and Division of Housing PSH

- Division of Housing served a maximum of 62 households assisting 103 adults and children
- HF Dual Diagnosis served a maximum of 44 households assisting 59 adults and children
- Veterans PSH served a maximum of 16 households assisting 25 adults and children

2020 CLINICAL SERVICES

A team of clinicians provide outpatient addiction recovery for men and women. We are a Specialized Women's Services clinic that uses gender responsive treatment modalities and supplemental services for moms. We provide individual treatment and group treatment addressing addictions to drugs and alcohol, trauma, and co-occurring mental illnesses. Each year the clinic provides services for between 75-100 clients. We usually see a client for three to six months.

- 83% had a mental health problem
- 89% of the program participants maintained housing stability
- 84% have at least one form of income from public assistance or earned income
- 90% are actively engaged in the program and regularly work with case management staff
